D. Required International and Comparative Politics Concentration (minimum of 30 semester hours)

Students are encouraged to develop their program of study early in their academic careers with the assigned departmental advisor for this specific concentration. The career-oriented concentration often includes an internship or a study abroad experience, and all concentrations require Statistics 2810. Copies of each student's program of study, signed by the departmental chairperson, must be on file in the Political Science Department Office as well as the Dean's Office in the College of Arts and Sciences.
